

Shaun Moore, Production Designer

Principally a TV Production Designer Shaun has also worked in film, theatre, corporate production and commercials.

Following a craft apprenticeship, and then art school, Shaun studied architecture, with a brief interlude on stage with the Garden Theatre Company, in Jamaica.

After 5 years in practice, he began post graduate research at the Department of Experimental Psychology, Oxford University, into the design of therapeutic environments for ADHD, while lecturing at Oxford School of Architecture. He moved to the States with his young family to finish his research, and to take up the position of Professor of Architecture at Kansas State University.

On his return to UK in 1984, with a giant change of career, he joined the BBC Scenic Design Department as a 'holiday relief design assistant', eventually becoming Senior Designer in 1996.

He became freelance in 1997, and won the RTS Design Award.

With a broad BBC portfolio from drama to education, sitcom to childrens', light entertainment to news and current affairs, Shaun now works in both UK and abroad. Specialising principally in the installation of newsrooms and news presentation studios, recent installations have been in Europe, the Middle East, and India.

Shaun has been involved in training all his professional life. While at the BBC he developed, and for eight years taught, Design for Film and Television at Chelsea College of Fine Arts.

Now working as a freelance designer, Shaun is also Director of his own training company, which runs art department short courses.

He is also an NVQ assessor and a Skillset Careers Advisor.
